








After I wash/sanitize my hands, I will follow the teacher's directions to get my day started. My teachers will wear masks and will keep distance from students.




My teachers will wear masks. The masks cover their mouths and noses, but we can still see their eyes!

outside! We will still get to visit the playgrounds. We will get to spend time outside for break and for recess. Sometimes we might even get to eat lunch








Recess will be different this year, but we will still have fun.
